Notes of the Annual General Meeting of the Lower Henlade and Stoke Road Residents Association held on Thursday 7 October 2010 at The Mount Somerset Hotel

1. TREASURERS REPORT

- 1.1 Mike Westlake gave a presentation of the accounts for the Association. Opening balance of £117 plus total income for the year of £156, less expenditure of £37 left a balance of £236.
- 2 CHAIRMANS REPORT
 - 2.1 Gill Ellis gave the Chair's report as follows:
- There was good membership with 41 households signed up out of a total of 51 and 1 honorary member;
- Notice board has now been erected; thanks were extended to the Parish and County Councils for their support and funding. Thanks were also extended to Steve Cozens for carrying out the task of erecting the notice board.
- Letters of objection had been sent regarding Taunton Deane's Core Strategy and the planning application for affordable housing in Stoke Road.
- The social element of the association continues to be well supported and events held during the year included walks in November and May, Christmas mince pies at the Mount Somerset Hotel, and Pub games night at The Nags Head, as well as the summer picnic and barbecue which once again enjoyed super weather.

- Gill presented prizes from the games night, the overall winners of which were "Ace" (John and Lisa Ashbaugh)
- Once again the community spirit was to the fore with the return of Baxter the wandering tortoise to his rightful owners.

3 ELECTION OF COMMITTEE MEMBER

3.1 Lisa Ashbaugh was proposed for re-election as a committee member, and was duly elected.

4 AFFORDABLE HOUSING

- 4.1 Gill Ellis reported that have been no recent developments on this Note 1 issue. Summerfield was no longer involved and the developer is now Raglan Housing. Rented housing is now included in the proposal.
- 4.2 Shirley Cozens reported that conversations with Wessex Water representatives indicated that were the build to proceed it would need to link into the main sewage which would require modernising
- 4.3 Gill gave an overview of the various planning bodies appearing and disappearing under the new coalition government.
- 4.4 It appears that Taunton Deane Borough Council is wary of developing this side of the motorway, and that currently major development at Monkton Heathfield seems to be their preferred option.

5 SPEEDWATCH

- 5.1 Mike Westlake gave an update on the Speedwatch initiative.
- 5.2 To date the team have undertaken the speed checks on 18 occasions. Over 3,000 cars have been checked, of which 8% were recorded at speeds in excess of 36 mph. The highest recorded speed is 51 mph, and the average for the speeding cars is 46mph.
- 5.3 The fastest speeds are along Greenway Lane with the lowest recorded at Bella Vista.

- 5.4 Speedwatch will be coordinated by Gill Ellis until Keith Hammond is able to take up the reins again and anybody who would like to be involved should contact Gill or Mike Westlake.
- 5.5 John Ashbaugh volunteered to help out.
